Approximately 30% of the Year 11 VCAL students (160 students) at Bendigo Senior Secondary College have undertaken a work placement, secured by the Goldfields LLEN, by the end of term two

Continuing support, if required, during terms three and four

Refinement of the 2019 practices to occur on August 20 this year, to plan further 'scaffolding' for the 2020 student VCAL cohort in partnership with the Bendigo TAFE Skills & Job Centre staff

Passions & Pathways is currently underway with grade six students at five schools culminating in a Student Expo on September 18, 2019 at the Bendigo Town Hall
Conversations are currently occurring with Campbells Creek Primary school in the Mount Alexander Shire for the introduction of Passions & Pathways in 2020

**Worlds of Work: Senior Secondary School Engagement
Quantitative**

Inputs

- New business placements

Outputs

- 30% of Year 11 VCAL students have undertaken work placements

Outcomes

- Student satisfaction surveys, (seeking increased knowledge of/and experience with the world of work) to be undertaken later in the year; providing data to ascertain the impact

Qualitative

Inputs

- World of Work induction curriculum completed and enhanced from 2018; further plans to improve for the 2020 student cohort

Outputs

- Informal discussions about the benefits students have gained about the world of work, shared with the GLEEN team via Senior College staff at Bendigo Senior Secondary College

Outcomes

- Students increased understanding of the world of work; hopefully confirmed through student surveys to be administered later in the year

Worlds of Work: Junior Secondary School Engagement Young Industry Ambassadors (YIAs)

Quantitative

Inputs

- YIAs available for training
- Training provided in Bendigo in June

Outputs

- 10 new YIAs
- 42 profiles currently on the GLEEN web site

Outcomes

- Increased engagement of YIAs in schools
- Engagement at:
 - Five Passions & Pathways Primary Schools in June & July
 - Future World of Work Forum, July 30 with approximately 2,200 Year 10 & 11 students from Bendigo and Castlemaine
 - VCAL students at Bendigo Senior Secondary College, February & March

Qualitative

Inputs

- Quality training and advice to new YIAs

Outputs

- Feedback from the GLEEN EO and recipients of YIA presentation to respective managers
- Certificates presented to YIAs and their respective work places by the GLEEN

Outcomes

- Increased awareness by students of the diversity of work places locally and the variety of pathways to employment

Worlds of Work: Junior Secondary School Engagement Mindshop Excellence

Quantitative

Inputs

- Students, hosts, workplace challenges and Mindshop facilitators

Outputs

- Will focus on solutions for the respective hosts workplace challenges including:

Bendigo Health and Bendigo South East Secondary College students

Keech Australia and Eaglehawk Secondary College students

True Foods and Maryborough Education Centre and Highview College students

Outcomes

- Genuine products that the respective hosts will use in their work places
- Authentic, applied learning for the students and an appreciation of the value of team work, team dynamics, problem solving and persistence in work places

Qualitative

Inputs

- Skilled facilitators providing the students, on day one, with a range of teaching and learning tools to support them during the week

Outputs

- Student presentations at the formal presentation ceremony at the end of the week to parents, teacher, hosts and Mindshop facilitators

Outcomes

- Pressure to perform and achieve a result within a week will enable the students to understand the demands of roles and outputs in a work place
- These experiences may support them to complete their senior secondary schooling

Worlds of Work: Upper Primary School Engagement *Passions & Pathways*

Quantitative

Inputs

- YIAs, tours and projects with five primary schools and grade six students

Outputs

- St Monica's Primary School
- Eaglehawk Primary School
- Lightning Reef Primary School
- Specimen Hill Primary school
- St Peter's Primary School have all engaged with components of the 'world of work' learning about the importance of completing Year 12 to increase employment options
- Refreshed web site (managed by the GLEN in partnership with Stanford Marketing); www.passionsandpathways.org.au

Outcomes

- 150 students participating from five schools
- YIAs engaged from diverse businesses including:
Coliban Water, Keech Australia, Lightning Reef Early Learning Centre, Bendigo Health, Bendigo Railways, Safescape, MSD Animal Health and THALES
- 18 tours to local businesses including:
THALES, Bendigo Tourism, St John of God Hospital, CFA, Fosterville Gold Mine, Dennis Homes, Bunnings, Botanic

Gardens, Peppergreen Farm, Bendigo Flying Club, Keech Australia, Hofmann Engineering, Ron Poyser Motors, Bendigo TAFE, Delecca's, BB Basil, La Trobe University and the Bendigo Schools' Trade Training Centre

- 19 Projects in business work places including:
Penno Design, Bendigo TAFE, Bunnings, Early Learning Centres, Kluwell Publications, Café Essence, Jools for Jim, NCCMC, Bendigo Pottery, Monash School of Rural Health the Emergency Services (Police/CFA/SES), Safety Systems and MSD Animal Health (several work places ran duplicate workshops)

Qualitative

Inputs

- Curriculum linked to the world of work and aligned to the Victorian curriculum; teacher led
- Steering Committee meetings held

Outputs

- New Tour Checklists and Project Books developed and utilised
- This material is in the process of being placed on the Passions and Pathways web site
- Steering Committee meeting materials to all Committee members
- Student-led Expo Invitations widely disseminated the GLLLEN, September 18 at the Bendigo Town Hall
- GLLLEN secured the Mayor of Bendigo to close the Expo; a highlight each year
- GLLLEN EO included Passions & Pathways in a presentation to the National Youth Commission and the Regional and Rural Education Consultation

Outcomes

- Stakeholder surveys to be undertaken later in the year

LLEN role in achieving the objective

Worlds of Work: Senior Secondary School Engagement

- Conversations and planning in partnership with senior College staff to develop the initiative, occurred in term one
- The GLLLEN team sourced skilled staff to work with the students in term one and part of term two and were part an evaluation meeting at the end of term two at Bendigo Senior Secondary College
- Increased business engagement, sourcing and adding new employees and opportunities to the SWL portal for the VCAL student cohort

Worlds of Work: Junior Secondary School Engagement

- The GLLLEN has trained 10 new Young Industry Ambassadors (YIAs) in June
- All YIAs are profiled on the GLLLEN website for engaging with students; sharing their respective pathways, post school and into further education, training and employment: www.gllen.org.au
- Leading the Mindshop Excellence Program during the week of August 26 – August 30 (30 Year 10 students will be solving an authentic

business challenge, over five days, provided by and working within the business)

- Working in partnership with the National Mindshop Excellence team to ensure a successful week's experience for the students and hosts including venues and catering

Worlds of Work: Upper Primary School Engagement

- The Goldfields LLEN is the lead partner and holds the funds from RDV
- The Goldfields LLEN EO submitted a new Tranche Two funded Project Plan for \$1.2 million over four years
- The EO leads and coordinates a vibrant representational steering committee including local government, education, business and industry; four meetings have been held this year
- The EO has secured a DET member to participate on the Steering Committee
- The Goldfields LLEN works closely with the Partnership Manager to secure new business hosts
- An evaluation framework has been developed (Program Logic) to ascertain the impact of Passions & Pathways having the potential to be a significant variable to contribute to student engagement with their learning and educational pathways; an important segue for the students, as they leave primary school into secondary school and the new Careers Curriculum Framework
