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## Introduction

This report has been produced by the Department of Education and Training, for Training Providers, and summarises training needs for the Loddon Mallee region.

It combines analysis of the region's labour market with existing government subsidised vocational education and training (VET) activity to provide insights on future training needs for specific occupations in the region.

This report should be considered in conjunction with the Funded Course List for 2019, which lists courses available for government subsidy and targets those courses that will yield the most value to the Victorian economy and community. It will assist Training Providers to align their proposed delivery in 2019 with the Government's objectives for the Victorian VET system.

## Overview

The Loddon Mallee region is located north west of Melbourne and extends from Mildura in far north-western Victoria, through regional centres such as Swan Hill, Kerang, Bendigo and Kyneton to the outskirts of Melbourne. The region's economy is largely dependent on agriculture, both irrigated dairy, horticulture and cropping along the Murray and dry land cropping and grazing in the Mallee and the south.

The region is a major manufacturing hub for food and beverage processing, defence and transport equipment. Employment is growing in the services sectors, particularly health and education. Related industries, such as IT, professional and business services are also seeing employment growth.

Loddon Mallee's age profile is likely to see growing demand for health and aged care services to support the region's ageing population. In addition, there are opportunities for upskilling in the region, given overall lower levels of educational attainment.

Bendigo Kangan Institute and SuniTAFE deliver training across the region.

## TRAINING PROVIDERS

## REGIONAL TRAINING DELIVERY

Table 3 includes courses with the highest number of government subsidised commencements in Loddon Mallee in 2017 along with comparative figures for 2016. Courses which align to occupations with high demand or a high volume of vacancies, listed in table 2, are noted. Training Providers should consider the employment requirements of the region in proposing their Program Delivery Plans.

Note: Only courses included on the Funded Course List 2019 are listed. Commencement data includes commencements in equivalent superseded courses.

### Table 3: Loddon Mallee training commencements by course (ranked by 2017 commencements)

Certificate III in Driving Operations commenced 505 students in 2016 and 590 students in 2017. This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

Certificate III in Carpentry commenced 600 students in 2016 and 509 students in 2017.

Certificate III in Individual Support commenced 444 students in 2016 and 314 students in 2017. This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

Diploma of Community Services commenced 160 students in 2016 and 283 students in 2017. This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

Literacy and Numeracy Support commenced 65 students in 2016 and 212 students in 2017.

Certificate III in Civil Construction Plant Operations commenced 441 students in 2016 and 212 students in 2017.

Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care commenced 266 students in 2016 and 205 students in 2017. This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care commenced 198 students in 2016 and 181 students in 2017. This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

Certificate I in General Education for Adults commenced 181 students in 2016 and 179 students in 2017.

Certificate IV in Community Services commenced 105 students in 2016 and 139 students in 2017. This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

Certificate IV in Disability commenced 113 students in 2016 and 128 students in 2017. This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

Certificate III in Roof Tiling commenced 178 students in 2016 and 124 students in 2017.

Certificate I in Transition Education commenced 169 students in 2016 and 118 students in 2017.

Certificate III in Agriculture commenced 442 students in 2016 and 112 students in 2017.

This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

Certificate III in Plumbing commenced 75 students in 2016 and 111 students in 2017.

Certificate II in General Education for Adults commenced 170 students in 2016 and 106 students in 2017.

Certificate IV in Training and Assessment commenced 118 students in 2016 and 105 students in 2017.

Certificate III in Landscape Construction commenced 95 students in 2016 and 101 students in 2017.

Certificate III in Civil Construction commenced 219 students in 2016 and 101 students in 2017.

Certificate III in Electrotechnology Electrician commenced 78 students in 2016 and 89 students in 2017. This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

Certificate III in Engineering - Fabrication Trade commenced 95 students in 2016 and 87 students in 2017. This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

Certificate III in Meat Processing (Smallgoods - General) commenced 0 students in 2016 and 85 students in 2017.

Certificate I in Spoken and Written English commenced 25 students in 2016 and 83 students in 2017.

Diploma of Nursing commenced 19 students in 2016 and 80 students in 2017.

Certificate III in Hospitality commenced 159 students in 2016 and 78 students in 2017. This course is aligned with courses in demand on table 2.

## Skills requirement

Table 4 provides a guide for Training Providers on the current employment size and anticipated training demand in Loddon Mallee, taking into account existing training patterns and employment demand.

This information is intended to provide broad indications of VET demand only. The information in table 4 only applies to 2019 skills needs; the data will be revised on an annual basis to take account of the latest developments in the Victorian economy.

## EXPLANATORY NOTES

Australian and New Zealand Standard Classification of Occupations (ANZSCO): ANZSCO is a classification used to organise data collected about occupations. Definitions are based on the skill level and specialisation usually needed to perform the tasks of the specific occupation, or of most occupations in the group.

Apprenticeship option available: Occupations noted are associated with one or more apprenticeships. Training delivery aligned to those apprenticeships is encouraged, irrespective of whether anticipated requirements for general (i.e. non-apprenticeship) courses aligned to the job are stable or decreasing.

VET related occupations: Occupations where VET training supplies all or some new entrants, or where VET training is undertaken to improve specific or generic skills for existing workers or new entrants in those jobs.

2018 employment: Estimated persons employed in the region in 2018, in occupations where VET training supplies all or some workers, based on Deloitte Access Economics' whole of Government Labour Market Forecasts.

Anticipated 2019 training needs (Region/State): Estimated requirement for all VET commencements in 2019 in the region and in Victoria, based on current employment, anticipated employment growth and current training patterns. Please note the following:

- Training requirements for a given occupation may be high in some regions and negative in others. When combined into a statewide requirement, these results may cancel each other out. Hence a single region's training requirement may differ significantly to, or even exceed, the statewide requirement (See, for example, Mixed Crop and Livestock Farm Workers on table 4). Where this occurs it is usually a sign of market misalignment. This means that one region's training delivery may far exceed its occupational needs while another region may have occupational needs that are not met by its training delivery.
- In some instances training requirements for a particular occupation are similar to, or greater than, the overall employment levels for that occupation in the region (See, for example, Automotive Electricians on table 4). This can happen for a number of reasons:
  - the occupation has a high staff turnover rate and requires a large number of entrants in the occupation to maintain employment levels
  - the region has a low historic course completion rate and requires a large number of students to commence in courses in order to fulfil the number of graduate entrants required (Estimated commencements required only consider course completions as potential employment supply, although the Department acknowledges that this is not always the case)
  - training requirements include workers in occupations who participate in training and further studies to upskill.

Statewide priorities: Jobs aligned to Victorian Family Violence and National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) workforces, and general infrastructure (including rail) projects, are

noted. As high profile Government initiatives, related job openings may increase more than the base anticipated employment demand across Victoria. Course alignment to government priority areas is reviewed on an annual basis to ensure currency.

## GUIDELINES FOR USE

Table 4 should be read in conjunction with table 5 to link anticipated additional training needs for each job to the VET course(s) which supply graduates for those jobs. In proposing their Program Delivery Plans, Training Providers should assess which courses on their scope, within the ANZSCO Unit Groups, will best service the anticipated additional training needs.

### Example 1

As indicated in table 4, Agricultural Technicians (table 4) have a relatively low employment base in the region (fewer than 50 workers). It is estimated that up to 50 commencements will be required in 2019 (denoted 1-50 in table 4).

Referring to this ANZSCO Unit Group in table 5, the course most aligned with Agricultural Technicians is the Certificate IV in Conservation and Land Management. Training Providers may wish to limit the number of places for this course in their Program Delivery Plans, due to the low anticipated employment demand, as explained above.

### Example 2

As indicated in table 4, Metal Fitters and Machinists have an employment base in the region of approximately 1,300. Around 500-600 new training commencements are anticipated for the region in 2019 to meet total training demand for this occupation. Table 4 highlights the ten VET courses that service this occupation.

Training Providers may wish to include these courses in their Program Delivery Plans, taking into account the training range required, as identified in table 4. A number of the courses associated with Metal Fitters and Machinists can be delivered as an apprenticeship, and unlimited delivery is permitted and encouraged for apprenticeship mode.

The following courses associated with Metal Fitters and Machinists can be delivered as an apprenticeship:

- Certificate III in Engineering - Electrical/Electronic Trade
- Certificate III in Engineering - Mechanical Trade
- Certificate III in Engineering - TCF Mechanic
- Certificate IV in Engineering

The 2019 Funded Course List identifies courses by their delivery mode, so training providers should cross-reference this document with the Funded Course List.

## Notes

### Apprenticeships:

Apprenticeship commencements are encouraged and no limits will be applied, due to the following specific needs of the occupations associated with these courses:

- long lead times - skills for these occupations are highly specialised and require extended training over three or more years, so the pipeline of apprentice graduates must be maintained irrespective of short term fluctuations in employment demand
- high use - skills are deployed for the uses intended, so there is a good occupational 'fit' between the course undertaken by the apprentice and the occupation
- high risk - disruption caused by skills being in short supply would impose a significant risk to the economy and/or community, particularly for occupations which have licensing and registration requirements.

Additionally, the rate of apprenticeship take up is closely related to available employment, given that apprentices and employers must enter into an employment contract. This

promotes greater opportunities for ongoing employment once the apprenticeship is completed.

Region/State training indicators:

In some instances, occupations may display no anticipated additional training needs in 2019 (indicated as zero in table 4) at both the regional and State level. Courses associated with these occupations may still appear on the Funded Course List 2019 and will therefore be government subsidised in 2019, in order to:

- cater for niche/thin market occupations which are important to the State or local economy and may require access to government subsidised training from time to time (including additional support from the Regional and Specialist Training Fund)
- allow for training in apprenticeship courses associated with those occupations, should there be demand
- maintain stability of the Funded Course List in cases where the demand for training varies from year to year but the associated courses still show high economic or community value to Victoria.

Training Providers should still consider these courses in their Program Delivery Plans in conjunction with this information.

## Free TAFE for Priority Courses

Table 7 lists priority courses which are included in the Free TAFE for Priority Courses initiative. Free TAFE for Priority Courses will reduce the financial burden for students wanting to train in courses that lead to jobs in demand from Victorian employers. From 1 January 2019, Free TAFE for Priority Courses pays tuition fees for priority courses for students who are eligible for government subsidised training. This includes:

- priority courses in a range of study areas (for non-apprenticeship training)
- apprenticeship pathway courses (sometimes called pre-apprenticeships)
